Community

Batavia is a suburban community of approximately 26,000 residents located 35 miles west of Chicago in the Fox River Valley.

School

Batavia High School is a public, four-year comprehensive high school serving 1,600 students in Batavia, Illinois. Our current senior class is 425 students.

Schedule: The school day consists of four 90-minute class periods with all classes meeting five days per week. We operate on a 4x4 block schedule which consists of four 90-minute classes each semester; one semester course equals one traditional year-long course. Some courses are offered as term courses which are 9 weeks and earn .5 credits which is equal to a traditional one semester course.

Grading System

Batavia High School **does not rank students** and **only reports weighted GPAs**. GPA is calculated at the end of each semester and is cumulative. Honors and AP courses receive an additional grade point value. Dual credit courses, offered in partnership with Waubesa Community College, are not weighted. Batavia High School has set a maximum GPA of 4.375.

In 2026, Batavia High School administered 881 AP exams, with 83% of exams earning a score of 3 or higher. AP examinations are optional for students enrolled in AP courses with 75% of students electing to take the AP exams.

Curriculum

We offer comprehensive college-preparatory curriculum with opportunities for students to pursue advanced coursework through Honors, Advanced Placement, dual credit and career-focused pathways. Honors and Advanced Placement courses receive an additional 1.0 weighted GPA point, while dual credit courses are calculated using the standard GPA weighting scale. Honors-level courses are available across multiple academic disciplines and provide students opportunities for increased academic challenge and preparation for postsecondary success. Dual Credit

Batavia High School provides students with opportunities to earn college credit through dual credit coursework in partnership with Waubesa Community College. Dual credit courses allow students to receive both high school and college credit while completing approved coursework. Dual credit classes are not weighted courses.
